From the Pastor

In my practice as a professional counselor, one of the problems I find that most Christians struggle with is the fear of living constantly in what I would call, "Worst Case Scenario Mode" ("WCSM" for short). That is, ALWAYS living as though the worst possible thing is about to happen - living in fear of what MIGHT happen. We justify this to ourselves as "being cautious," but this often goes beyond such normal, prudent caution and right into something quite different and ultimately opposite to a life of faith. Living regularly in WCSM changes us. It preconditions us for failure, even for disaster, and even if the WCS doesn't happen, it might as well have because we have been living under the control of the fear of it.

Fear and change, like hate, and even love, are in essence connections to people, emotions, states of mind and outcomes in life. If we are constantly looking for problems, that is what we will find most often. If we are on a team and expect to lose, we will likely lose. That isn't where Jesus intended to leave us.

In 1 John 4:16-19 we read, "So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us" Jesus' victory over sin and death was also a victory over fear. It was a vindication of the power of love over hate, over fear and even death itself. How does that help us? Well... what if, instead of going through life expecting the worst, we live in hope and in love, expecting that, no matter what, God's love will prevail over all things. We are free, then, from the power of fear and loosed to live in hope. Instead of looking for the worst to happen, what if we EXPECTED TO FIND THE BEST CASE?!?! What if we actually believed that Jesus is alive? That he actually conquered sin? That he is with us each day? That he calls us into service in his kingdom - not to fail, but to joyously succeed in love and hope? What if we believed and trusted in a God whose normal mode of operation is to bring good out of evil, joy out of sorrow, hope out of fear, and life out of death.

In Romans 8:26-30, one of the most powerful and impossible to believe sections of scripture, the Apostle Paul writes, Likewise the **Spirit helps us in our weakness**; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. **We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.** For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

Christ IS Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Allow him to live in you. Blessings, Rev. John

Stephen Ministry

In his book *Finding God in Unexpected Places*, Philip Yancey tells the story of a young South African woman who spent a year visiting inmates at one of the most brutal prisons in her country. Day after day, she shared stories that depicted reconciliation and forgiveness. After a year the inmates were transformed. Incidences of violence dropped from close to 300 down to only 2. When asked how she achieved this, her reply was, "Well, of course, God was already present in the prison. I just had to make him visible."

Time and again, in our relationships as Stephen Ministers with our care receivers, there are revelations of God's presence all along. It is in these "aha" moments that hurting people often understand that they were not alone when they thought they were; there was healing that got lost in the shuffle of their lives. These are the sparks that allow us to fan the flames of reassurance and hope.

Like the prisoners in South Africa, we too are prisoners.

The illusion that we are free. . .free to come and go, free to direct our lives, choose our soul mates, and expect stability. . can vanish in a moment when something unexpected intrudes. When we get that scary phone call; when we lose our job; when we are suddenly and accidentally injured, we can find ourselves sliding down a very slippery slope.

At times like these, the questions for each of us will be: Can I continue to hold God's hand? Can I even find it? Can I pray and can I hear the answer in the chatter of worry? Can I be calm enough to remember His presence in the past? Will it be reassurance for the present? Can I go it alone or do I need someone to walk alongside me? This is what the body of Christ is for and why Faith Community UMC is a Stephen Ministry congregation. Call Becky Cultice, Referrals Coordinator at 937-376-5747 to learn more.
