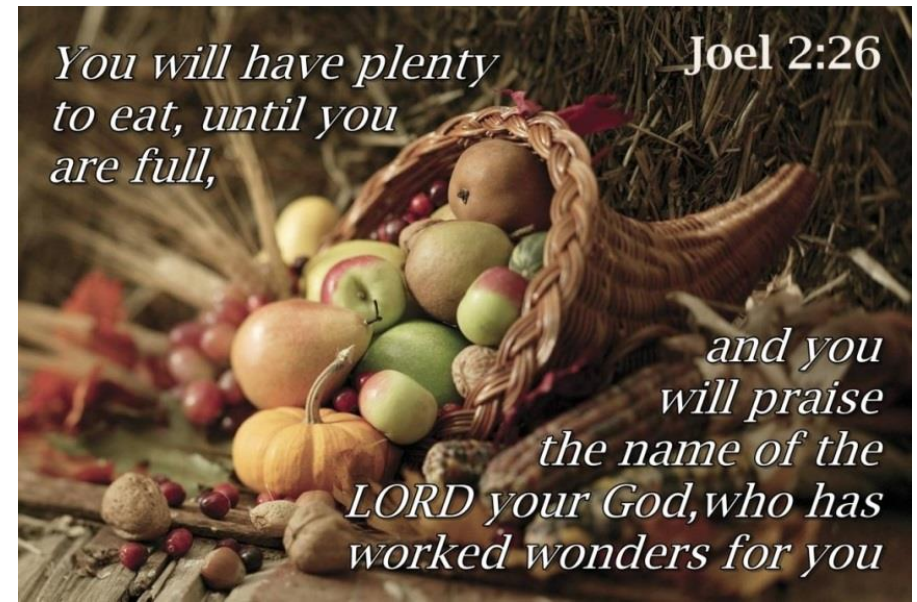
Double I meet in 15C, Leader Wayne Cook, study of "Thanksgiving Day Reflections and Ideas."
