### **Stephen Ministry**

Stephen Ministers Share Newly Acquired Resources Faith Community has access to a gem that some have yet to discover—our libraries. If you haven't already visited our adult library, I challenge you to do so. Few congregations have such an incredible collection of materials available. Stephen Ministry has a designated section within this library. Located there are books covering a variety of topics—parenting. Serious illness including a cancer diagnosis, grief, suicide, miscarriage, care giving, and aging. If you or someone you know is going through a difficult time, there may be a resource there that would be helpful.

One of our most recent additions is It's Not Supposed to Be This Way: finding unexpected strength when disappointments leave you shattered by Lysa Terkeurst. For lots of reasons, life often turns out very differently from what we hoped or expected. Some things happen suddenly or unexpectedly that throw us off kilter temporarily. Others shatter us completely. We feel disappointed, sabotaged, and maybe even wonder how God fits into all of it. As Lysa writes in the introduction, "This is how the formula should calculate: hard times plus healing time plus staying faithful to God should equal the exact good outcome we were counting on. If you are a human who has been doing the adult thing for more than twenty-four hours, you've probably come to the same stunning revelation as I have. We cannot control our outcomes. We cannot formulate how the promises of God will actually take shape.

And we will never be able to demand any of the healing from all the hurt to hurry up."

She goes on to offer hope. "Though we can't predict or control or demand the outcome of our circumstances, we can know with great certainty that we will be okay. Better than normal...Sometimes to get your life back, you have to face the death of what you thought your life would look like." At the end of each chapter there's a recap of the chapter, scripture to help fill us as we empty ourselves of our misplaced hope and limited perspectives, questions to consider, and a prayer. Turkeurst knows firsthand about disappointment and pain. After twenty-five years of marriage she learned of her husband's affair and had to tell him, "I love you. And I forgive you. But I cannot share you."

Disappointments are an inevitable part of life. The important thing is how we handle them. As my deceased husband used to say, "Did this experience make me better or did it make me bitter?" We may not have a choice about what happens to us, but we do have a choice about what we do about it.

Read It's Not Supposed to Be This Way to discover how disappointments and trials can be a gift from God that feels nothing like a gift at all. Terkeurst doesn't offer bumper sticker quotes that never help and often hurt. She offers real help and a true hope that God will hold us safe through whatever we're experiencing.

Her most recent book has also been added to the Stephen Ministry section: Forgiving What You Can't Forget: Discover how to move on, make peace with painful memories, and create a life that's beautiful again.

## A Voice for Environmental Stewardship April 2022

As I promised in the March 2022 issue or our church newsletter Faith Links, I am going to share about our opportunity to plant trees on your property or elsewhere. As you know, planting trees will help to fight climate change and global warming. This is something positive that each of us can do as individuals without waiting for governments or organizations to take concrete action.

For the last few years I have donated evergreen and broadleaf seedlings to the people of Faith Community United Methodist Church. They start out small but they will grow when we take care of them. If you want to start with a sapling or larger tree, tree nurseries have them to purchase.

This year I have decided to provide a larger selection of tree seedling species than before. My seedling distribution day will be April 24th, the Sunday after Earth Day April 22nd. The species that I have this year are the following: 10 White Pine, 10 Norway Spruce, 3 Dawn Redwood, 3 Bur Oak, 3 Northern Pecan, 3 Red Maple, 3 White Dogwood, and 3 Red Bud. I will also have some wildflower seeds. If you are interested in a specific species of tree you can Google the name of the tree and you can find out what the tree will look like when it is grown, and how big it can grow in the best location.

Since I am giving you the list of species in this Faith Links, which you will get in the mail by April 1st, you will have time to Google your tree species information before distribution day on April 24th.

I believe you know how important trees are for the wellbeing of our precious Mother Earth, they are her LUNGS.
