From the Pastor

"To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven."

No, I'm not quoting The Byrds (although some of you now have that song stuck in your heads. You're welcome). That quote comes from the Bible, Ecclesiastes 3:1. It is the truth that everything on this earth, including churches, go through various seasons. Some things come to an end; other things experience a new beginning. We are entering a season here at Faith Community United Methodist where it is time for us to be together in one worship service once again.

Beginning this month, June 5, we will have only one worship service on Sunday mornings. The service will be in the sanctuary at 10:30 AM. Over the next several months we will be working on incorporating a wider variety of music into our one service rather than dividing into two.

Over the summer, Sunday school classes for adults will meet 9:15-10:15 AM. Classes for children and youth will not meet over the summer. On the fourth Sunday of each month, beginning June 26, there will be a Coffee and Fellowship time in the Fellowship Hall

at 10:00 AM. For that one Sunday of the month, Sunday school will dismiss early in order to enjoy fellowship with members of other classes and those who do not attend Sunday school. We'll try this schedule over the summer and if adjustments are needed, we'll make changes in the fall. After all, everything under heaven is just for a season.

June 5 also happens to be Pentecost Sunday. We will have a Pentecost celebration lunch after worship that day. (Remember to wear red.) In addition to celebrating the Holy Spirit and the gift of this church, we will also celebrate all the musicians who have contributed their gifts to both of our worship services this past year. We have been tremendously blessed by their talents, and their gift to our experience of worship.

One final word about June 5 and that has to do with Holy Communion. June 5 is Communion Sunday. For the first time since the Pandemic we will be passing plates with the precut bread and cups of juice. For those who are not comfortable with taking the unsealed elements, the prepackaged kits will still be available. The ushers will have a plate of prepackaged kits just as they have a plate for gluten-free bread. For everyone else we will have the regular bread and juice.

I appreciate your flexibility and cooperation as we go through these transitions. As much as I have enjoyed this season of having two distinct services and there is much that I will miss about it, I believe it will be a blessing for us to all be worshiping in one service together.

The Challenge of Change

Challenges in life are inevitable. That is a given. Sometimes the challenge is anticipated; sometimes it is unexpected. All of us experience change. Loved ones die; jobs end, as do relationships. People relocate, couples marry, babies are born, and children leave for college. Change, both good and bad, can take an emotional toll. Guess what? Positive changes can be just as difficult to adjust to as negative ones.

Sometimes we are able to handle change on our own or with the help of family and friends. Sometimes we need professional help. Sometimes it helps to have a Stephen Minister, a Christian friend to walk alongside us for as long as needed.

Here are some suggestions that may make it easier to adjust to change:

When a good change happens, accept it with grace. Embrace the positive however it shows up and celebrate it. When a negative change is looming, try to look for alternative ways of coping before it actually happens.

Day-to-day-changes often go unnoticed in spite of the fact that they occur. It's when we are caught off-guard that we're most likely to become discombobulated. Emotional change can be particularly difficult. At times like these it is often almost impossible to be objective. Sometimes we need to process our feelings and that may take time.

If the challenges in our lives are overwhelming, we don't have to deal with them all by ourselves. Friends, family, support groups, counselors, and our church family may be available, but we have to reach out and ask, which can be hard to do. The love and support of those who care about us can help make these times more bearable.

We don't have to like change, but we have to at least tolerate it when it happens. We need to find a way to cope because change happens whether we like it or not.

A Stephen Minister is there for those going through a time that challenges their ability to keep on keepin' on. A Stephen Minister listens, prays, and encourages. God loves us all, and sometimes a Stephen Minister is His tool to reach out and carry us when we are facing a challenging time. A Voice for Environmental Stewardship-June 2022

Please go with me back to December 24, 1968. On that day William Anders was in the crew of the lunar orbiter, Apollo 8. He took a photograph of the Earth, just rising above the horizon of the moon's surface. It was a half Earth, like we see a half moon at night. This was the first color picture of the Earth from space. It was so striking that it was given the name, Earthrise. A well-known nature photographer, named Galen Rowell, described the photograph as "the most influential environmental photograph ever taken". What did Rowell mean by the statement? Earthrise was the first color photograph of our beautiful Earth, showing our planet being illuminated by the Sun. It showed the beautiful blue oceans, the brown and green continents, and the distinct patterns of the clouds in our atmosphere. Many beautiful pictures of our Earth have been taken since then, revealing many more features of our beautiful planet.

Our planet is much, much more than a blue marble in our solar system. Our planet is unique in our solar system. It is the only planet that supports LIFE as we know it. There are millions of species of amazing plants and animals on Earth that make us the LIVING PLANET that we are. So far, even with all of our robotic vehicles on the surface of Mars, we have not found evidence of life as we know it. Our spacecraft that are traveling to other planets and photographing them at "close range" are finding no other planet that even comes close to the living planet that we live on.

We are even looking at the MOONS of the other planets in our solar system in order to see if they might have some chance of supporting subsurface life of some form.
