**Dear Faith Community,**

### **A Voice for Environmental Stewardship**

#### **Our Carbon Footprint**

When it comes to the crises of global warming and climate change, which I believe, most Americans NOW BELIEVE is real and not a hoax, it is easy for us to feel helpless. We are not helpless.

In previous articles I have written about our CARBON FOOTPRINT, meaning the impact that we are having on our Earth by our daily activities that put excess CO2 into our atmosphere. When we breathe we exhale CO2, as all animals do. This is not excess CO2. Excess CO2 is the unnecessary CO2 that we produce by our other daily activities that contribute to abnormal greenhouse gas emissions. There are a few ways that we can do this: 1) Driving low gas mileage cars and trucks. By low gas mileage I mean those vehicles that get less than 40 mpg of gasoline. This includes the vast majority of cars and trucks on the road today The remedy for this is to drive hybrid or electric vehicles. Most hybrid vehicles (with both gasoline and electric motors) also have low greenhouse gas emissions. For instance, KIA Niro and the Toyota Prius regularly get over 50 mpg with low greenhouse gas emissions. Many car manufacturers are now offering hybrid options and some car makers are offering electric vehicles (EV) which don't use any gasoline but are only powered by an electric engine. EVs don't produce any greenhouse gasses, but the electricity they use comes mostly from fossil fuel burning power plants that still produce greenhouse gas emissions. (2) Forty-seven

percent of our home energy usage comes from heating and cooling. If we are conscious of our energy usage, in cold weather we can keep our homes cooler and wear warmer clothes. In warmer weather we can keep our homes warmer and wear cooler clothes. Keeping our thermostats at 70 degrees Fahrenheit is a good compromise. 3) Thirteen percent of our energy usage is from our lighting. Leaving the lights on in rooms that we are not occupying is wasting electricity and money.

So the best defense against worry is staying in communication with Me. When your thoughts turn to Me, you can think much

more positively. Remember to listen, as well as to speak more positively, making your thoughts a dialogue with me.

If you must consider upcoming events, follow these rules, 1) Do not linger in the future because anxieties sprout up like mushrooms when you wander there. 2) Remember the promise of My continual Presence; include me in any imagery that comes to mind."
