Why Are We So Reluctant to Ask for Help?

“I can do it myself!” An angry toddler screamed and pushed away her parent who was trying to help her. “I can do it myself!” How many of us have observed a similar scenario? How many of us may have even been the screaming toddler? As adults we can still have this attitude of “I can do it myself!”

Over the many years I have been a part of Stephen Ministry, I have witnessed more than a few refusals—polite refusals—but refusals nevertheless. The refusal often comes as “I don’t want to be a burden,” “You must have people who need help much more than I do,” or “It’s not so bad; I’ll be fine.”

What is behind this reluctance? Pride, fear of losing control, or shame might be part of the reason even when the help is needed and certainly could be beneficial. Maybe we can do it ourselves, but why should we when we don’t have to?

We have all heard the expression that it is better to give than receive. I believe the reverse is true more often than we might realize. As my neighbor reminds me if I am the least bit reluctant to accept something she’s offered, “Don’t take away my blessing.” It is important for us to be gracious receivers as well as gracious givers.

It takes courage and humility to ask for help. We are called to be a blessing to others. It is not a one-way street. When we accept care we are engaging in God’s work too.

We are honoring the one offering help. Relationships develop and deepen. There are times when all of us need help, and then there are times when we can offer support.

At Faith Community we have many opportunities to give and receive. Stephen Ministry is one. Stephen Ministry provides confidential, Christian, one-on-one care for as long as is needed. 
