## **Stephen Ministry**

#### What does Stephen Ministry Mean to Me?

Stephen Ministry continues to be a life-changing experience. While I wasn't sure whether or not It would be a good fit for me, others in our church in Connecticut encouraged me to take the training. I've never regretted that decision. In fact, serving as a Stephen Minister was so important to me that when we relocated in 2006, we knew we would eventually join a church with an active Stephen Ministry program. Stephen Ministry is about relationships. Without breaching confidence, I can say that my life has been enriched enormously because of the individuals that I have been privileged to walk alongside. I've learned a lot from each relationship. I've been humbled and I have grown. It means opportunity. I was commissioned as a Stephen Minister in the spring of 2003. Jesus' promise that "Where two or three are gathered, there I am also" became real. Stephen Ministry continues to offer me a way to discover, cultivate, and use the spiritual gifts I've been blessed with.

All aspects of my life have been enriched by the distinctively Christian caregiving skills I've learned and strive to practice. I experience joy as I see God working through me to bring hope and healing to a hurting person. I also grow spiritually as I experience the Lord's loving presence in community with other Christian caregivers. When we get out of the way, God does amazing things through us. When we prayerfully turn over the situation to God, He provides the resources we do not have. We are never alone in the process. We have Pastor Jeff, Stephen Leaders, the benefit of the Greater Dayton Stephen Ministry Network, and the resources of Stephen Ministries, St. Louis.

The Christ-centered nature of Stephen Ministry is reflected in the logo which is on the banner in the hall leading to the Community Center and in the stained glass piece hanging above the entrance into the narthex. A broken person behind the cross and a whole person in front of the cross symbolize that we are all broken people and it is only through Jesus and the cross that we can be made whole.

As you assess your spiritual gifts and recognize those of others, consider becoming a Stephen Minister yourself or encouraging those who have qualities that seem compatible with Christian caregiving to explore the possibility of becoming Stephen Ministers. # **A Voice for Environmental Stewardship**

#### **Our Precious Planet**

About 8 years ago, my grandson Austin, then 4 years old, and I took a trip to the Carriage Hill Metro Park, north of Huber Heights. In the visitors center was a small book store. In it I found a book with the title <u>Earth Matters</u>, edited by David deRothschild, published by 2008 DK Publishers. In it I found inspiring chapters about many of the ways that our Earth is full of fascinating features that make Earth so special in our solar system, including the history of our Earth, the history of life on Earth, the different environments and ecosystems found on Earth by region. He talks about the animals and plants that inhabit those regions. Dr. Rothschild is an adventurer and ecologist who appreciates how unique our Earth is in our solar system and about how our precious planet is in the whole of our Universe.

I know that astronomers have been eager to find other stars with planets that are habitable, but so far they have found none. Such a planet is described as being in "Goldilocks Zone". The planet would have to be just far enough from it's star for water to be in liquid form that would make life as we know it possible. Of the 1,780 planets that have been found beyond our solar system only 16 have been found to be in the habitable zone. And even if they are in the habitable zone, the planet has to have an atmosphere that would support life as we know it, with plants and animals like we have, not to mention civilizations. When I was in high school in the early 1960's, I wanted to be an exobiologist. Of course, at that time there was no field of study like that.

Our Earth is obviously VERY PRECIOUS. Anything that humans do that threatens the habitability of our Earth is crazy. We have initiated significant global warming and climate change just within the last 50 years or so. Our use of fossil fuels for energy is the culprit. Now we have a CLIMATE CRISIS. We must work intensively to adopt renewable energy on a huge scale before it is too late. The use of solar panels, wind turbines, geothermal energy (heat pumps in our homes), and the use of hybrid and electric vehicles, DO NOT pollute our precious atmosphere with excess CO2. There are many things we can do to combat global warming and climate change. WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE.


