# Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve

Many of you are acquainted with the beautiful Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve in Clifton. It is just south of St. Rt. 343, less than one mile from Clifton. I have been working at the CGNP since 2014 when I became an OHIO CERTIFIED VOLUNTEER NATURALIST. Wayne Cook is also an OCVN. I mainly work as an interpretive naturalist at the nature center. I have always wanted to become a naturalist since I majored in biology in college. My father inspired me. He was a self-taught geologist, photographer and naturalist.

Geographically CGSNP is well within the temperate zone of North American forests. As a nature preserve, it protects the forest plants, animals, geology and the scenic Little Miami River. It is home to 347 species of wildflowers, 105 species of trees, shrubs, and over 200 species of birds have been seen visiting the gorge. Also, scores of species of mammals, large and small, including bats that make their home in the gorge, not to mention the many species of reptiles and amphibians. The number of species of insects is innumer-

able. There are many well maintained trails of varying degrees of difficulty for people with differing abilities.

Clifton Gorge is also a natural wonder. The 60 feet deep gorge was mainly formed from the melted waters of the Wisconsin glaciation that started receding about 14,000 years ago. The glacier covered a large portion of what would become northern Ohio.

A nature preserve is a perfect example of Environmental Stewardship. The State of Ohio is very invested in the creation and maintenance of state nature preserves. In fact, there are 144 state nature preserves, large and small, in Ohio. The Division of Natural Areas and Preserves is part of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Governor Mike DeWine, whose home is between Cedarville and Yellow Springs, is very supportive of natural areas and preserves.

There is much life and there are many wonders to protect in Ohio. The Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve is the closest to us in Greene County. The Nature Center is open to the public from the first weekend of April to the last weekend of October, Friday to Sunday, 10 am to 4 pm. COME VISIT US.
