Loss is a Given, but We Don't have to Go it Alone If we could eliminate something from our life journey, many of us would choose loss. It's been with us to one degree or another since childhood when we lost a teddy bear or a favorite baby blanket. As adults it may have involved losing a job, moving and needing to start over, going through a divorce, drifting away from a life-long friend, or ultimately saying goodbye to a loved one who dies. Throughout our lives, we learn that loss is inevitable and hard. It doesn't feel right. We

know that this wasn't God's original plan, but thanks to Adam and Eve's actions, we still experience loss. It is often unexpected. Loss can easily make us feel overwhelmed and out of control. Letting go can be really, really hard, and none of us know what it will be like to walk through something we haven't yet experienced. We may feel a little unsettled or disoriented as if "the bottom has fallen out." At times like these, it's essential for us to know that there is someone who will be there with us no matter what, offering support, healing, and comfort for as long as needed.

Because of Jesus, we have hope that helps us carry through times of loss. Will it be easy? Of course not. But can we turn to Him and make it through? Absolutely. Whether it's seemingly insignificant to the world (but not to us), or if it's one of the most devastating situations we've ever had to face, He is present. We are reminded that God draws near to us in a special way during the toughest times. "The LORD is near to us in a special way during the toughest times. "The LORD is near to the brokenhearted" (Psalm 34:18). The familiar and comforting "Be still, My Soul" reassures us of His presence no matter what we face: "Be still my soul, the Lord is on thy side. Bear patiently the cross of pain; Leave to thy God to order and provide. In every change he faithful will remain."

Loss is a part of life. Saying goodbye to anything or anyone can be extremely challenging but letting go is easier when we remember that the One we're turning to and holding onto is forever holding on to us. There is always room for hope. As Romans 8:28-29 reminds us, nothing can separate us from the "love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

#### **The Endangered Species Act**

Climate change and global warming are massive changes that have effected changes in many of Earth's ecosystems. They have caused the rapid decline of hundreds of species within families of animals and plants on Earth. Another way to describe this loss is to say that these animals and plants are being threatened with extinction because of environmental changes in their habitats. Habitats are also lost because of the expansion of housing and businesses, including agriculture. As the Earth's human population continues to grow, now at 8.2 billion, more and more natural habitats will disappear.

Our government, with great bipartisan support, wisely passed the Endangered Species Act in 1973. It seeks to protect our endangered species. In the U.S. many notable animals have been saved from extinction including: the California condor, the bald eagle, the grizzly bear, the humpback whale, and many species of birds, have recovered under the Endangered Species Act.

Many countries that have unique animals within their borders also have conservation laws that are protecting their unique animals. Gorillas, amazing African elephants, and various species of the rhinocerous are also endangered. Poachers kill rhinos for their horns which are sold and used in traditional Chinese medicine.

God has given us this amazing planet teeming with life of all kinds. IN FACT, ALL ANIMALS AND PLANTS WERE THRIV-ING ON EARTH LONG BEFORE HOMO SAPIENS CAME ON THE SCENE. The least we can do is CHERISH and PROTECT THE CREATURES THAT SHARE OUR PLANET WITH US.
