#### **Meet the Handbell Choir Director**

Jim McPeek was raised in a household full of music. His mother was an accomplished pianist and at an early age, Jim was singing in the church choir along with his parents.

During high school, he accompanied the men's and women's choirs and played for many special events. He played his trombone with the jazz band and concert band, as well as special events and also played with a big band in West Virginia while in high school. He attended Westminster Choir College where he worked with a variety of choirs and learned about conducting.

Jim graduated from Dennison University with a piano scholarship and of course, played with several of the bands and orchestras during this time. Professionally, he has played with dance bands, combos and even an Elvis Presley tribute band where his sister was a backup singer and his brother played in the band.

One of the highlights of his career involved playing with a band in Atlantic City. The band was hired to play nearly non-stop in a parking lot there. The Beach Boys were performing nearby and Jim's group were privileged to view some of those performances.

In 1988, he accepted a position as choir director for a Presbyterian church in Newark where he remained for about ten years, directing both the vocal and handbell choirs. One of his greatest joys was when he played a nine-foot Steinway grand piano. For those who are not familiar with pianos, this is the grandest of the grands.

He taught choir and general music at Central Middle School from 1996 to 2005 when he retired from teaching. When asked how he happened to accept a job in Xenia, he told the following story: In August, the music teacher at Central Jr. High accepted a last minute position teaching in her home town, leaving Central without a music instructor. The Assistant Superintendent of Xenia Schools contacted Dennison University to see if the school could recommend someone for the position and the name of Jim McPeek was given. Jim was interviewed on Thursday, accepted on Friday, and school began for the year on the following Monday. Someone said that grade level was tough to teach, but he found it very rewarding and enjoyed the experience.

Jim is very complimentary of the members of the Faith UMC handbell choir, saying they are the BEST. Jim has played with the Greene County Concert Band for over 20 years, also with the Ray Foster Band, the Christmas Band and several more musical groups which keep him busy. Sometimes he plays bells with the choir in addition to directing.

# A Voice for Environmental Stewardship Marine Life

I grew up in New Jersey not far from the Atantic Ocean. Numerous times my family would go to the ocean for a retreat from small town inland life. Mainly I lived in Orange, a crowded suburb of Newark, and Verona about 6 miles to the west. I lived in New Jersey for the first 22 years of my life. I grew to love the Atlantic Ocean, especially Island Beach State Park. As a child, I remember getting excited when we came close to the ocean. I could smell the salty breeze coming off of the ocean and could hear the call of the seagulls and the crash of the waves on the beach. When I finally got on the beach I would see the horseshoe crabs and the tiny sand crabs digging in the sand. I would see the sea kelp that had washed up on the beach with the waves having been torn from the sea kelp forests off shore. The salty spray would get in our noses and when we would dive into the waves our bodies would become covered with sand and salty ocean water. What a delight!. This experience was a far cry from life as a landlubber.

The ocean has enriched my life so much that when I was a biology major at Montclair State College, I was considering becoming a biological oceanographer. Even though I have lived in Ohio since 1970, I still love the ocean and have been a member of Ocean Conservancy for years and have even taken a course in oceanography with The Great Courses.

Ocean Conservancy was founded in 1972 by scientists and ocean enthusiasts in order to protect the oceans world-wide from the pollution caused by plastics produced and discarded by humans, waste water released by cruise ships and fishing nets lost by fishing boats and ships. It is heartbreaking to see pictures of sea turtles snagged in lost fishing nets. Many sea creatures are endangered by ocean pollution. Even large marine mammals like manatees (also called sea cows) and whales of many sizes are endangered, injured or killed by boats and ships when they collide in the open ocean. The

Ocean Conservancy is partnering with stakeholders who use the oceans for their businesses in order to reduce and eliminate endangering sea creatures.

It is mindboggling to realize how many species of large animals there are that inhabit our Earth's oceans and the air above them. Protecting that life is an important issue when we consider ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP. Respecting the life that God has put on this planet is a moral issue. Let us stand up for all life on this PRECIOUS PLANET EARTH. God is counting on us who were made in His image.
